### A NOTE FROM YOUR ASSISTANT PRIEST

I'm really looking forward to a day out that I'm having at Wydale this month. Any time spent at Wydale is a bonus for me - but I think this one is going to be something special!

Canon Christopher Collingwood, who works in and from York Minster, is coming to talk to people concerned in spiritual direction about Faith and Doubt. This is what he writes:

Do you have doubts? If so, what do you do with them?  
Do you ignore them and hope they'll go away, or do you stay with them  
however uncomfortable they may be, and let them lead you into a deeper  
relationship with God?

Christopher intends to show us how exploring our doubts can in fact deepen and strengthen our faith. Wow! What an exciting and challenging day lies ahead of us!

I have always rejoiced in the fact that in the Church of England, our faith in God through Jesus our Lord rests on three pillars - Scripture, Tradition, and Reason.

**Scripture:** the Bible informs and inspires our faith. In the New Testament, we meet Jesus and his first followers; in the Old Testament, we read the writings that Jesus knew and loved and we hear of God's inspiration to the Jewish people throughout history.

**Tradition:** in the Church we join together with Christians throughout the world and throughout the ages to praise and glorify God and to meet together in the Sacraments, in prayer and in fellowship. We rejoice that all Christians are brothers and sisters in the family of the Church.

**Reason:** we celebrate that God has created us to be rational creatures, capable of knowing right from wrong; able to choose different paths and make our own decisions. Through reflecting on and reasoning about our faith, often in discussion with other Christians, we grown in wisdom and in love, as God intends us to. Through sharing our questions and doubts, we become mature Christians through the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

You can see why I am looking forward to this day course at Wydale! And don't leave it too long till you visit Wydale - it is a beautiful and restful place at any time of the year. Why not come with me next year on June 7? I am leading a Quiet Day on Strength and Fragility - how God relates to us at every stage of our lives. See you there!

## MIDDLETON BOOK GROUP

"The Guernsey Literary and Potato Peel Pie Society" by Mary Ann Shaffer was our book for July. None of us had come across the author before, and it turned out that this was in fact the only book by her. It is written as a series of letters, which can be a bit daunting initially (having to keep checking who is writing what and to who until the characters fill out) but we all agreed that it was a very enjoyable read. Some of the writing and characters are quite whimsical, there are plotlines that you can't wait to see resolved, and there is the darker side, as you find out more about the German occupation of Guernsey in the last World War.

We felt that the balance of the more humorous side of the book and that underlying dark background was very sensitively managed; we all enjoyed the book, but several of us felt we now wanted to find out more about that aspect of the war which we had not come across before.
